

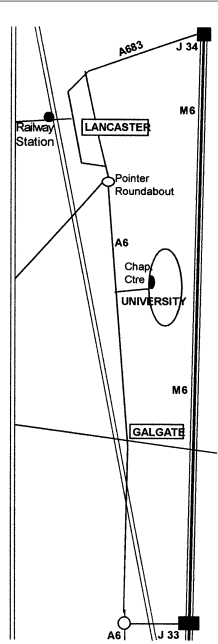
**Routes to the University  
By Rail & Bus**

Lancaster University lies approximately 3.5 miles south of the city of Lancaster. Taxi services are available from both rail and bus stations (**taxi rank tel. 32090**)

The bus station is situated on **Damside Street** about 5 minutes walk from the railway station by the castle. The **no. 1** provides a direct link between the city and the university campus and it runs every 15 minutes. The **40, 41** and **x42** also stop at the entrance to the university by the tennis courts, from where there is a 5-minute walk to the Chaplaincy Centre.

**By Road**

Leave the **M6** motorway at **junction 33** and take the **A6 north** towards Lancaster. After about 1.5 miles, having passed through **Galgate** village, you will see the University buildings to the right of the road; **turn right** at the traffic lights into the University's main drive. This leads to a **roundabout** at the top of the hill. Take the **first exit** from the roundabout, then the **first avenue on your right** - the Chaplaincy is on the left-hand side.

## Speakers

**Ellen Teague: Climate Change: consequences for the poor**

Poor communities, especially in Africa, Asia and Latin America have been the first victims of climate change. They face increasingly severe weather, ranging from significant periods of drought to relentless flooding that washes away homes and crops. Yet, as support agencies are putting adaptation and mitigation measure in place, the communities too are struggling to build a better future.

**Ellen Teague** is a freelance Catholic journalist who writes and campaigns on Justice, Peace and Ecology issues. She writes regularly for *The Tablet*, *Messenger of St. Anthony* and *Redemptorist Publications* and has edited *Vocation for Justice*, a publication of the Columban Missionary Society, for sixteen years. A former history teacher, she worked with the Volunteer Missionary Movement in Nigeria in the 1980s and then for CAFOD as their Education Campaign Coordinator for eight years. A key focus was CAFOD's *Renewing the Earth* campaign, which examined the links between development and the environment. She is part of the coalition of environment and development agencies which has produced three 'Up in Smoke' reports, suggesting that the Millennium Development Goals cannot be met if climate change is not addressed adequately. She is married with three sons.

**Sr Margaret Atkins: "For us there is only the trying":

**Sr Margaret Atkins** is a member of the Augustinian community at Boarbank Hall, Grange-over-Sands. She taught theology for ten years at Trinity and All Saints College in Leeds. She has a particular interest in ethics and environmental issues.

**Leo Pyle** is Visiting Professor in chemical engineering Manchester University. During his career at Imperial College and Reading University he developed a special interest in the use of renewable resources for energy and food and its implications for poor countries, involving him in work in South America, Africa and Asia. Leo is also a member of Lancaster Diocesan Faith & Justice Commission.
